

# Chicago Tutor/Mentor Program Locator – Making it Work:

In this and related PPTs you can see screen shots of an on-line program locator that Tutor/Mentor Connection started building in 2004. It is designed as an On-Line Collaboration Tool Designed to Help Tutor/Mentor programs grow in all high poverty neighborhoods of Chicago and similar cities.

# Tutor/Mentor Program Locator Screen Shots

The <http://www.tutormentorprogramlocator.net> site was built by different developers between 2004 and 2009, using html and older databases. It's not working properly, and could be completely rebuilt. The screen shots in this and two other pdfs are intended to show what is on the site now, that would need to be rebuilt in a new site.

This map view is just one of the pages hosted on the web site.

The green stars represent sites of tutor/mentor programs, gathered in ongoing surveys.

*11/19/15...In early November volunteers were able to get the site to open and function, but today it is once again showing error codes when opening these pages.*

(1)The Map Gallery is hosted on the program locator site and was built using html. It works.

(2) This opens a set of pages used to collect and edit data about tutor/mentor programs. A PDF is available to show these pages.

(3) This opens to a screen that enables users to search for programs in specific zip codes.

(4) This opens to the OHATS documentation system.



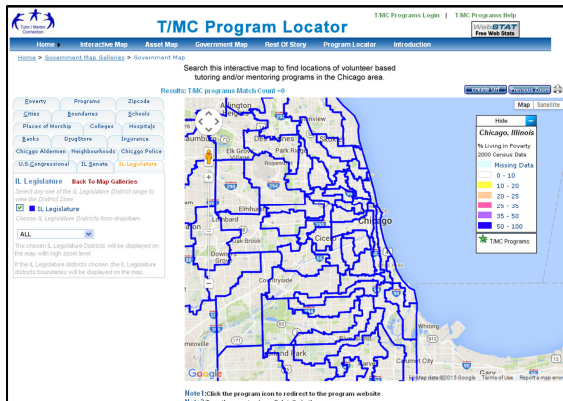

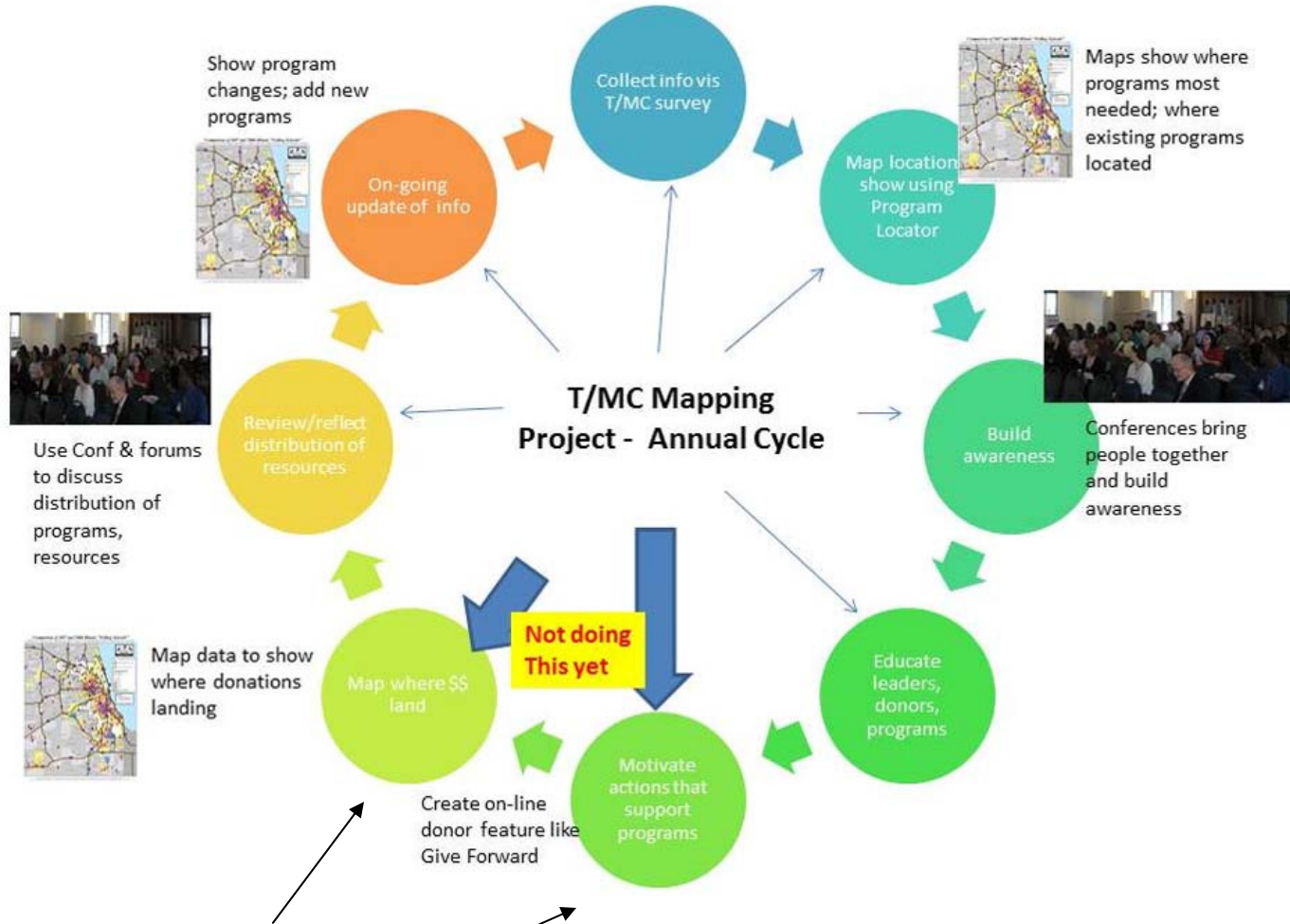
This is what you see now when open the government maps pages.

Across the top you see three categories. When you click into each the top three boxes a new page, showing boundaries should appear, as shown below. You can highlight specific districts. Since data base not working, info on map does not show up.



We never were able to build map views for the three categories shown on bottom role.

Once the Program Locator is working properly, this is the next step.



If we can create a portal that encourages donations to programs, and that enables us to report donation amounts by program, and by map region, we can increase our impact on flow of resources and improve the flow of information about programs to the portal.

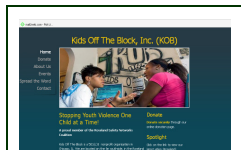

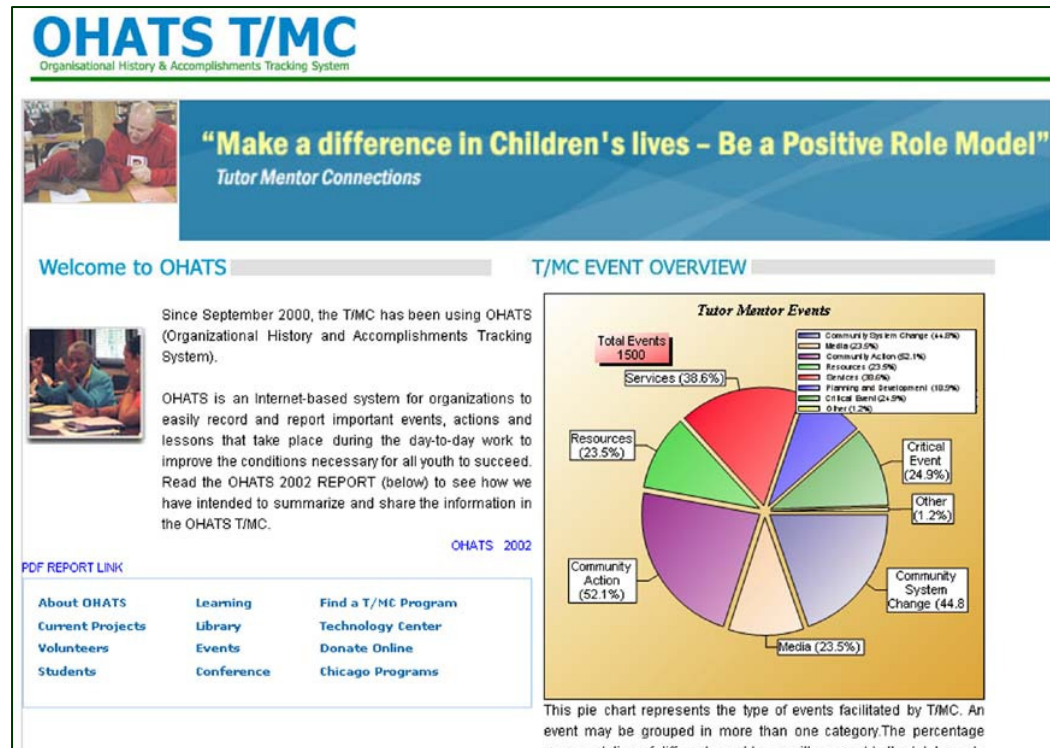
